

The Environmental Protection Agency hereby amends a specific exemption issued under the provisions of section 18 of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, to the Idaho Department of Agriculture (IDA) for the use of formetanate hydrochloride, formulated as the product Carzol Insecticide, to control thrips on dry bulb onions in Idaho. The exemption is amended by having condition #6 read as follows:

6. The following plant-back restrictions must be followed:
  - No restrictions for onions
  - No restrictions for non-food crops grown for seed: roots and tubers, cole crops, leafy vegetables, and bulb vegetables
  - No restrictions for livestock feed crops: alfalfa, clover, crown vetch, grass, lespedeza, lupine, trefoil, and vetch, including these same crops grown for seed.
  - 30 days for leafy vegetables
  - 120 days for cereal crops
  - 120 days for root and tuber crops
  - 120 days for all other crops

All other conditions and restrictions in the original authorization of May 19, 2006 still apply
